
Teens, in the "You Are Here" weekly programs, can do crafts and games from around the world throughout July. And all ages have until July 30 to get rewards for time spent reading.

RFID will help staff & patrons

The Library's recent leap to an RFID security system means a better library experience for patrons in many ways.

Radio-frequency identification (RFID) is a technology that uses communication through the use of radio waves to transfer data between a reader and an electronic tag attached to an object for the purpose of identification and tracking. RFID makes it possible to give each item in the library's collection its own unique identifying number.



What does this mean to you? Faster checkout, including soon-to-arrive self-checkout stations; better security; and easier tracking of materials.

The Kyova Branch is the first to get the technology, which the board of trustees approved in the spring. All branches will have it soon.

The first self-checkout machine is scheduled to be installed at Kyova this month, with three more at Main soon after. Not only will the machines speed up checkout times, they will offer a choice between paper or email receipt, and the ability to use credit/debit cards to pay library fees.

The system will not replace any library staff; it is meant to enhance our customers' experience. Please let us know what you think.

A bevy of beautiful bookmarks

BCPL has a new and exciting way for you to read your favorite books. Beginning later this summer, NOOKcolor devices will be available for checkout. There will be three genres: bestseller fiction; best-seller non-fiction; and young adult. Each device will be loaded with a maximum of 20 titles, and can be checked out for three weeks, with no renewal. Holds can be placed on them at **www.thebookplace.org**. The Library also recently started adding movies on Blu-ray to its collection, as well as video games for Xbox Kinect, Wii Motion and PS3 Move. Requests for specific titles can be made on the web site.
